A Bit Of The History Of Wilson Timbers

The company we know today know as Wilson Timbers started as T. Wilson & Son Pty Ltd in 1955.

Tom had been a timber seller since 1928, when he worked for Butt and Co before establishing "Fibro Construction Co" in 1936 and operated it until 1940. Tommy decided to "restart" a timber merchant operation in 1955 and invited his son Colin (who we all know as Col), who had returned from Korea, to join him at double the army pay of £7.15 per week.

T. Wilson & Son opened their first yard at Dutton Park on the site of an old sawmill. After a few years a second yard started operating on Annerley Rd (opposite the Red Brick Hotel – a popular drinking hole many people would remember).

Tom and Col made customer service a priority, treating their customers as they would like to be treated in addition to providing the best timber possible.

As the company grew, land was purchased at Davey St, Moorooka and the business operated from both yards until in the "sixties" when it was decided to trade only from Davey St. The exact date of consolidation has faded from memory.

After Tom Wilson's death in 1966 and the company changed its name to Wilson Timbers Pty Ltd Col continued the business during economic highs and lows. Then in the eighties Wilson Timbers expanded and opened a second yard at Ipswich (which has flooded twice in recent memory).

Colin's wife Sue worked alongside of him in the business until about 14 years ago when she left day to day operations and worked as a director of the company – which she remains until this day. Col's son-in-law Nigel Shaw worked for Col as a sales rep for many years.

After Colin's death in 2014, Nigel Shaw, Colin's son-in-law, has taken over the long running family business.

The commitment the team at Wilson Timbers make to our customers today has not wavered from Tom and Col's standards back in the 50's. Our customers are always assured good ol' fashioned helpful service, and of course the best timber available – this is shown in the fact we have accounts still with us today whose fathers had accounts with Wilson Timbers when they were in the building industry.

Similarly, we count many clients today who did their apprenticeships working for builders who are customers and when those apprentices went into business for themselves – they continued to come to Wilson Timbers.





For All Those Times That Grip Tape On Your Stair Treads Just Isn't Good Enough!

Dressed timber stairs look amazing don't they? Dressed timber staircases are a major design feature many home owners want to impress their friends and family with. Exactly what your client wants when they are renovating an upscale home.

The only problem is that they are a safety nightmare – if you get them wet – it's almost guaranteed someone will walk on them, slip and break their neck... that's why these stairs need anti-slip. Unfortunately most builders just use grip tape – that stuff you put on a skateboard as the anti-slip on their treads.

And if we're all honest, it looks terrible.

Thankfully, our products engineer and king of the CNC Router – Caleb- has come up with a better answer. One that says class and sophistication – not 'my kid just had their skateboard taken off them and raided for its grip tape.'

He's machining grooves in the treads and setting aluminium inserts in the grooves. The inserts are only 1.5-2mm above the tread so they meet the criteria for anti-slip and aren't a trip hazard. At the same time the metallic colour contrasts with rich timber tones for 'visual appeal.'
