- Is a dense timber, evenly grained, minimal defect and no gum vein thanks to the dry growing environment
- Has an even pale reddish brown, colouring – excellent aesthetics
- Is Dura Class 1 timber, S2 structural rating
- Not susceptible to Lyctid Borer so chemical treatment to sapwood is not essential
- Has minimal surface checking compared to other Ironbark species

If you need a 'job lot' of Ironbark we can get it to you in 8 days. For example, if you order it from us on a Tuesday before 4pm we can have it delivered to your job site the following Tuesday.

The same is true for all of the common hardwoods we supply.
