Selection of the right quality of materials, following best practices in design, construction, finishing and maintenance all make a difference how well an outdoor timber structure ages and remains usable.

Following a lot of standard industry practices an outdoor timber structure might last for 20-25 years before it needs significant repairs or needs to be replaced.
